AROUND THE SEC

• **Georgia's Trey Thompkins**, a 6-foot-10, 247-pound sophomore forward from Lithonia, Ga., was named the SEC Player of the Week after he had 21 points, seven rebounds, two assists, two steals and one block in a victory over Illinois on a neutral court last week. Thompkins, who had missed two practices leading up to the game after having his wisdom teeth extracted, sank four decisive foul shots in the final 22 seconds against the Illini. For the season, he has made 11 of 12 free throws in the final five minutes. It marked the second time this season and the seventh time in his 37-game career that he reached the 20-point mark. Thompkins now leads Georgia in scoring, rebounding, blocks, field goals made and field goals attempted.



• **Ole Miss' Reginald Buckner**, a 6-foot-8, 233-pound forward from Memphis, Tenn., was named SEC Freshman of the Week after he averaged 9.5 points on 88.9 percent shooting from the field to go with 5.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks in leading the Rebels to wins over UTEP and Centenary. Buckner had four points and a blocked shot to help Ole Miss jump out to a 12-2 lead over UTEP in the opening four minutes of the game. He registered a season-high 11 points (5-of-6 from the field) to go with six rebounds and three blocks in the 91-81 OT win over UTEP. The Memphis native added eight points, four boards and three blocks in just 11 minutes of action in Saturday's 108-64 blowout against Centenary.



• Five SEC teams are receiving mention in the Dec. 21 Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today preseason polls. Kentucky (3rd Associated Press/3rd ESPN/USA Today), Ole Miss (15th/21st), Tennessee (16th/14th) and Florida (18th/18th) are each listed among the Top 25. Mississippi State is receiving votes in both polls.

• Kentucky needs one win to become the first program with 2,000 all-time victories. The Wildcats are the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 1,999.

• With four blocks against Bethune-Cookman on Nov. 21, Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado became the SEC's all-time blocked shot leader, breaking Shaquille O'Neal's (LSU) record of 412 from 1990-92. Varnado currently ranks in a tie for fifth in NCAA Division I history with 452 career blocks.

• The SEC is well represented in the NCAA statistics as Mississippi State is the national leader in personal fouls per game (12.2) and Florida is second the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense (.233). MSU ranks fourth nationally in blocks per game (8.4) while Kentucky (8.1) is fifth and South Carolina (8.0) is sixth. Arkansas' Rotnei Clarke leads the NCAA in three point field goals per game (4.3) and is second in three-point field goal percentage (.544) while Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado is third national in blocked shots (5.3). Tennessee's Tyler Smith is second in the nation in assist-turnover ratio (4.22) and Kentucky's John Wall is third in the nation in assists (7.0).

SEC Highlights

- Five the SEC's top 10 scorers from 2008-09 return for 2009-10. USC's Devan Downey is the league's top returning scorer at 19.8 points per game.
- Seven of the league's top 10 rebounders from last season return for 2009-10. Arkansas' Michael Washington led the SEC with 9.8 boards per game.
- Eight of the conference's top 10 assist leaders from 2008-09 return for 2009-10. Arkansas' Courtney Fortson is the top returning setup man after leading all SEC freshmen with 5.9 assists per game last season.
- Five players that earned first team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches are on SEC rosters for 2009-10. Kentucky's Patrick Patterson, LSU's Tasmin Mitchell, Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado, South Carolina's Devan Downey and Tennessee's Tyler Smith are were first team all-conference selections in 2008-09. An additional five players that earned second team All-SEC accolades also return.
- For the first time in league history, each of the 96 conference games will be televised live as part of the SEC's historic 15-year agreements with CBS Sports and ESPN that begin this year. Almost half of the SEC's league games will be distributed nationally with ESPN or ESPN2 televising 27 contests, ESPNU showing eight and CBS Sports five. The SEC's games on the ESPN family of networks will be exclusively branded as the "SEC on ESPN."
- National coverage of the SEC Basketball Tournament has been expanded with the semifinals and championship game broadcast on ESPN on ABC. The SEC Network will televise the first two rounds of the tournament which this year will be played March 11-14 in Nashville.
- Florida's Billy Donovan will be honored with the John R. Wooden Award's "Legends of Coaching Award" at the Los Angeles Athletic Club in April of 2010.
- According to KenPom.com, in 2008-09 eight of the Southeastern Conference's 12 teams ranked among the 90 (out of 344 total) youngest teams in the nation. Ole Miss (344), Arkansas (340), Vanderbilt (338), Mississippi State (321) and Florida (312) each rank among the 35 youngest squads.
- Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 10 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.
- Two SEC schools ranked in the top four nationally in attendance for 2008-09. Kentucky led the nation with an average of 22,239 fans per game and Tennessee was fourth nationally with an average of 20,483 per game. Syracuse was second in the nation in attendance at 21,044 and North Carolina was third with 21,035. Kentucky has led the nation in attendance 13 of the last 14 seasons.

- The SEC individual statistics were dominated by youth in 2008-09. Among the league's statistical leaders, only five of the top 30 scorers, five of the top 30 rebounders and two of the top 15 assist-men were seniors.

- Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last seven editions of the NCAA Tournament.

- The SEC is one of just two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the Associated Press top 25 (excluding preseason polls) since 1999-00. Simply stated, every SEC team has been a top-25 team nationally at one point in the last 10 seasons. The ACC is the only other conference that can make this claim.

Seven SEC Players On Preseason Wooden List

Seven SEC players have been named preseason candidates for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy, announced Wednesday, August 19, by Richard "Duke" Llewellyn, Wooden Award Chairman and founder.

SEC players on the list are: South Carolina's Devan Downey, LSU's Tasmin Mitchell, A.J. Ogilvy of Vanderbilt, Kentucky's Patrick Patterson, Tennessee's Tyler Smith, Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado and Ole Miss Terrico White.

The list of candidates is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor.

In late December, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the National Ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

The 34th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winner, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All-American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 9-11, 2010.

Eight SEC Players On Preseason Naismith List

Eight Southeastern Conference men's basketball student-athletes were among the 50 players on the Naismith 2009-10 preseason watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Oct. 29.

Included among the SEC's candidates are: South Carolina's Devan Downey, LSU's Tasmin Mitchell, Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy, Kentucky's Patrick Patterson, Tennessee's Tyler Smith, Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado, Kentucky's John Wall and Ole Miss' Terrico White.

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2009-10 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2010 NCAA Men's Final Four in Indianapolis, Ind.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the Top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

Five SEC Guards In Contention For Bob Cousy Award

Five student-athletes from the SEC are among the 72 candidates that have been nominated for the 2010 Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford Financial Services, The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., announced Dec. 17. The annual award, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes college basketball's top point guard. Devan Downey (South Carolina), Bobby Maze (Tennessee), DeWayne Reed (Auburn), John Wall (Kentucky) and Chris Warren (Ole Miss) were SEC guards included among the 72 candidates.

This original list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 by January 1st, final 10 by February 1st, and final five by March 1st. A Hall of Fame appointed screening committee will be narrowing down the candidates from 20 to 10 to 5 prior to the Blue Ribbon Selection Committee evaluating the final

five candidates and ultimately choosing the winner. These Hall of Fame committees are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2010 Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Monday April 5th in Indianapolis as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

Lowé's Senior CLASS Award Candidates

South Carolina's Devan Downey and Tennessee's Tyler Smith - student-athletes who excel both on and off the court - have been tabbed as candidates for the 2009-10 Lowé's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School™, the Lowé's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

The list of 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of classroom, character, community and competition.

SEC/Big East Invitational

The third annual SEC/Big East Invitational was held Dec. 9 in New York City and Dec. 10 Tampa, Fla. The two-night men's college basketball event started with a doubleheader in New York City on Dec. 9 and was followed by a doubleheader in Tampa on Dec. 10. St. John's took a 66-56 win over Georgia in the first game at Madison Square Garden in New York City and then No. 4 Kentucky defeated No. 14 Connecticut 64-61 in the nightcap. Mississippi State took care of DePaul 76-45 in the Tampa opener and then No. 10 Florida fell to No. 7 Syracuse 85-73 in the second game. It marked the second consecutive season that the SEC and Big East had earned a split in the event with both conferences winning two of four games each year.

There are three active SEC players who have recorded a triple-double.

Arkansas' **Courtney Fortson** recorded just the second triple-double in school history when he had 20 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists against North Carolina Central on Dec. 10, 2008.

Tyler Smith became the first player in Tennessee history to record a triple-double when he accumulated 12 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists against UNC Asheville Dec. 3, 2008.

Jarvis Varnado registered Mississippi State's third recorded triple-double with 10 points, 12 rebounds and 10 blocks against Kentucky Jan. 15, 2008.

The SEC posted the largest attendance season attendance in league history, totaling **2,638,852** fans for games featuring SEC teams in 2008-09. It marks the third consecutive year more than 2.5 million fans witnessed SEC basketball. A then-record 2,562,073 fans saw SEC basketball in 2006-07 and 2,561,545 were in attendance for the 2007-08 season.

How Sweet It Is

The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 19 of the last 20 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

SEC Among Final Four Leaders

In the last 17 NCAA Tournaments (1993-2009), the SEC's 12 Final Four appearances are the second most by any conference.

The SEC has had a total of five different teams to make the national semifinals, behind only the Big Ten's seven over the 16-year span.

SEC teams have made a total of 22 all-time appearances in the Final Four (27 including five appearances by Arkansas prior to joining the SEC).

First Round Success

The SEC is 41-20 (67.2 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 11 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979)

Spreading The Wealth

Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

Alabama went 1-1 on the week by defeating Samford, 60-45, and falling to No. 17 Kansas State, 87-74, in Mobile, Ala. The Crimson Tide fell to 1-2 against ranked competition this season with the loss. Saturday's game was Alabama's fastest paced of the season with each team having nearly 80 possessions. Alabama entered the game averaging 66 possessions per game. Alabama forced 22 Kansas State turnovers, a season-high for the Wildcats, and has now had seven straight opponents commit more than their season average in turnovers. In its last five games, Alabama has had a +39 advantage in turnover margin and forced 102 total turnovers. Kansas State's 87 points were the most the Tide had surrendered this season and the most since November 24, 2008. In its four losses, Alabama's opponents have shot 50.5 percent from the field and 47.7 percent from three point range ... in the team's seven wins, opponents have only converted at a 40.3 percent clip from the field and 27.9 percent from three-point range. Alabama's opponents to date have won 56.1 percent of their games, the second highest opponent winning percentage in the league.

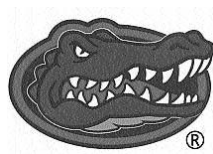

This is the fifth meeting between Auburn and Alabama State with the Tigers winning each of the previous four games, three in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum and a 63-60 nailbiter in Montgomery two years ago. In Auburn, the Tigers defeated the Hornets 98-79 Dec. 11, 1989, and 102-62 Dec. 17, 1994, and 77-72 exactly one year ago today. Auburn head coach Jeff Lebo is 2-0 against Alabama State as a head coach as the Tigers defeated the Hornets 63-60 two seasons ago in the Acadome in Montgomery and 77-72 in Auburn exactly a year ago today. Auburn closes out its three game in six days stretch against Alabama State on Tuesday. Auburn is facing its third in-state opponent of the season in Alabama State. The Tigers won at Alabama A&M 87-52 on Dec. 1 and lost to Troy 81-77 on Dec. 4. Auburn will take its second long break of the month as it will take six days off for the holidays following the Alabama State game. The Tigers will play Charleston Southern on Dec. 29 in Auburn in its first game after Christmas. Auburn just had nine days in between games for final exams from Dec. 8-16. Nearly half of Auburn's games this season have been decided by four points or less and the Tigers are 2-3 in those. The Tigers defeated Niagara 69-65 and Virginia 68-67 while losing at Florida State 76-72, to NC State 60-58 and Troy 81-77. When trailing with 15 seconds remaining, Auburn defeated Niagara and Virginia. When tied with 15 seconds remaining, Auburn lost to NC State. The Tigers took the lead on Virginia with 1.4 seconds left and Niagara with 12 seconds left. NC State broke the tie with Auburn with 1.3 seconds to go. Auburn leads the SEC with 9.3 steals per game.

Florida dropped its second straight game, falling to Richmond, 56-53 at the Orange Bowl Classic. The loss snapped a eight-game winning streak for UF at the Orange Bowl Classic and was the Gators' first loss in the event since 1997...After jumping out to a 32-19 lead, UF was outscored 37-21 over the final 22 minutes. UF's backcourt of Kenny Boynton and Erving Walker, averaging 26.6 points and 9.0 assists per game entering, was held to just 15 points and two assists on 5-of-23 shooting. After surrendering 16 offensive boards and 17 second chance points against Syracuse, UF out-rebounding Richmond 42-34 and held the Spiders to just six second-chance points on the night. Florida entered the game leading the nation in three-point field goal defense, but surrendered seven on the evening, including five in the second half. The Gators will try and snap their two-game skid on Tuesday night at home against South Alabama in a rematch of the 2006 NCAA opener, won by UF.

Tigers completed its return from final exams with four victories – 73-62 over Northwestern State (Dec. 12), 77-60 over Southeastern (Dec. 14), 63-60 over Nicholls State (Dec. 17) and 65-61 over Rice (Dec. 19.). In the Nicholls State game, Tasmin Mitchell hit a go-ahead game-winning three-pointer with 36 seconds left to give the Tigers their 79th consecutive home win over a Louisiana school, a streak that now dates back over 21 years. During the week, Mitchell finished up a series of games in which he had two double doubles, four straight games scoring over 20 points and a season high of 28 points and 18 rebounds. Storm Warren posted four straight double doubles to give him a league leading seven and just missed getting his eighth as the league's leading rebounder had 11 points and 9 boards against Rice. Bo Spencer had his fourth 20-point game of the season to lead the Tigers past the Owls with 22. LSU left Sunday for the Cougar Hardwood Classic in Seattle at KeyArena where the Washington State Cougars play an annual game. They are 4-0 in the Classic and a record crowd for the event of close to 13,000 is expected as Trent Johnson returns to his birthplace of Seattle and Aaron Dotson, the LSU freshman guard, also returns home after prepping at Rainier Beach HS. The game is at 9 p.m. CST and will be televised on CBS College Sports. The team will then break for Christmas before returning to play Dec. 29 at Xavier. LSU's next home game is Jan. 2 against Utah.

The Ole Miss Rebels posted some big numbers in a 108-64 rout of Centenary on Saturday. Andy Kennedy's team scored the most points since a 108-70 win over Lamar in 2007 and secured the largest margin of victory since a 2001 win over Morris Brown. The Rebels were locked in all game, shooting 67.7 percent for the contest, including a 75 percent clip in the second half. Four players notched double figure points, led by Terrico White's 17 points, while 10 Rebels scored at least six points. Ole Miss finished with 32 assists against the Gents, one shy of the school record. It was a different sort of game than the previous three, where the Rebels needed late comebacks to down Southern Miss, McNeese State and UTEP. Chris Warren continues to light up the scoreboard with his 18.3 ppg average. He is averaging 20.3 ppg in his last four, and he needs just 29 more points to reach 1,000 for his career. His two 3-pointers against Centenary gives him 163 for his career, tied for the fourth-most in school history with former Rebel Jason Harrison (1999-02). Ole Miss will have a nationally televised top-25 showdown against the West Virginia Mountaineers on Wednesday in Morgantown, W. Va. The game will be shown live on ESPN2 at 7:30 p.m. ET.

With Rick Stansbury at the helm, MSU has now put together at least a six-game winning streak in 10 of his 12 seasons. With five blocks at Houston, Jarvis Varnado now has 452 for his career (tied for 5th most in NCAA history) and is just 83 shy of tying the mark of 535 set by Wojciech Mydra (1998-2002) of Louisiana-Monroe. The Bulldogs are 9-0 this year when holding opponents to 45 percent shooting or less from the floor. With 124 made 3-pointers, Raven Johnson is one away from moving into MSU's Top 10 career list. Barry Stewart is now 33 made 3-pointers shy of tying Darryl Wilson's school record of 258. After setting a single-season record last year with 296 made 3-pointers, the Bulldogs are on pace to make 316 by the end of the regular season. MSU is three wins away from going undefeated in December for only the third time under Stansbury (2002-03, 2003-04). The Bulldogs entered the Houston contest having not trailed in four-straight games, a streak that ended early in the first half against the Cougars.

Devan Downey led Carolina with 18 points against Richmond, the 49th time he's led the Gamecocks in his career in the Garnet and Black. Johndre Jefferson picked up his first career double-figure scoring game in Carolina's win over Richmond with 12 points. Three of South Carolina's newcomers this season (Jackson, Galloway, Jefferson) have reached double figures at least once in a game. Carolina's 80% (12-15) shooting from the foul line against UR was its top performance of the season when attempting at least 15 foul shots. Also against UR, Austin Steed matched his season high with six points, while his six rebounds were a season high. Wofford spoiled Darrin Horn's 200th career game as a head coach, earning a 68-61 victory on its home court over the Gamecocks on Saturday. Downey (17), Sam Muldrow (10) and Brandis Raley-Ross (14) each registered double-figure points in the loss. Senior forward Evaldas Baniulis matched his career high with four assists in the contest. Senior walk-on Robert Wilder also picked up a steal vs. the Terriers. South Carolina will host Furman on Monday in its final contest before the Holiday break.

The ninth-ranked Tennessee Volunteers (8-2) split their two games last week, defeating Wyoming in Knoxville on Tuesday before falling at Southern California Saturday. UT's two losses this season both have come away from Knoxville, as the Big Orange also dropped a one-point game to top-five-ranked Purdue last month in the championship game of the Paradise Jam ... Sophomore Scotty Hopson (14.1) remains Tennessee's top scorer this season, followed by seniors Tyler Smith (11.3) and Wayne Chism (11.3 ppg). Eight Vols area averaging at least five points per game. Tennessee is outscoring its opponents by an average of 19.3 points per game through 10 contests while also boasting a +1.9 rebounding margin and one of the nation's top turnover margins (+7.3). With 38 assists and nine turnovers on the year, Smith owns the top assist/turnover ratio in the SEC at 4.2. The Vols are shooting .489 from the floor this season while shooting .369 from 3-point range and .675 from the free-throw line ... Tennessee is holding the opposition to .282 shooting from long range and is forcing 19.6 turnovers per game. Tennessee hosts North Carolina A&T Wednesday in Knoxville (7 p.m., CSS) and are then idle until visiting Memphis for a non-conference, in-state clash on New Year's Eve (3 p.m. CT, ESPN2). Wednesday's game against the Aggies gives the Vols a chance to build on their perfect 14-0 home record in the month of December during the Bruce Pearl era (2005-06 to present).

Vanderbilt improved to 7-3 on the season, while Tennessee State fell to 3-9 ... Vanderbilt has now won nine in a row at Memorial Gym, including all four games this year. VU's last home loss was against Florida on Jan. 25, 2009. Today's meeting was the seventh all-time between Vanderbilt and Tennessee State. Vanderbilt now leads the all-time series 7-0. All seven of the games in the series have been played at Memorial Gym. With the win, Vanderbilt is now 55-7 against teams from the Ohio Valley. Vanderbilt Head Coach Kevin Stallings is now 4-0 all-time against Tennessee State. With Jermaine Beal's three-pointer with 19:28 remaining in the first half, Vanderbilt extended its consecutive games streak with at least one three-pointer made to 739. VU is one of only three schools (UNLV and Princeton) that have made at least one three-pointer in every game played since the three-point line was established for the 1986-87 season. Only UNLV (746) has a longer streak than Vanderbilt. Vanderbilt shot a season-high 67.9 percent from the floor, a new Stallings-era record; previous best was a 67.3 percent effort against Auburn on March 13, 2008. Vanderbilt's shooting percentage also surpassed its high mark of 62.0 percent against South Carolina last year. Vanderbilt shot 79.2 percent in the second half. Vanderbilt's 21 assists were a season-high. The 21 assists also topped last year's high mark of 19 at Auburn and at UMASS.
