- Hit a three-pointer with 8:29 left in the first half to give the Lady Bulldogs the lead for good and ignite a 13-1 spurt that turned a one-point deficit into a 10-point lead.

## Team Notes

### Alabama Crimson Tide

The Alabama women's basketball team split a pair of road contests in the Sunshine State last week to move to 6-5 on the season. In Monday's game, Alabama was able to escape from UCF by a score of 64-62 playing solid defense on the Knights' final drive. The Tide had trouble scoring in Wednesday's matchup with Florida A&M and suffered a 61-52 defeat. Against UCF, juniors LaToya King and Varisia Raffington tallied a team-high 12 points to help lead Alabama past the Knights. The Tide shot 44.3 percent from the floor in the contest and collected 10 steals. In Alabama's loss to the Rattlers, senior Dedrea Magee led the Tide in scoring with 12 points, while senior Tamara Williams collected a team-best 10 rebounds. Junior Tierney Jenkins led Alabama with three assists, while Williams and Raffington collected a trio of steals apiece. The Tide plays Presbyterian College on Monday, Dec. 21 before it has a nine-day break from competition for the holidays.

### Arkansas Razorbacks

The University of Arkansas is in the midst of a three game losing streak with one game to play at the Duel in the Desert in Las Vegas, Nev., this week. Arkansas faces either VCU or Kansas State in the final game of the tournament. Sophomore Lyndsay Harris posted 23 points in a losing effort against DePaul Saturday but the Razorbacks have struggled with poor shooting percentages in their most recent contests. Arkansas breaks for the holiday returning to campus Dec. 26, to prepare for a Dec. 29 contest with Sam Houston State. It is the final non-conference game for Arkansas and the first of three consecutive home games - the longest home stand of the year.

### Auburn Tigers

The Auburn women's basketball team (8-3) picked up at 71-50 win Sunday at South Alabama in its lone game of the week. The Tigers were led by senior KeKe Carrier with 23 points, her second 20-point outing of the season. Alli Smalley followed with 13 points while freshman point guard Morgan Toles rounded out the double-digit scorers with 10. The Tigers now break for the Holidays and will return to action Dec. 28-30 at the San Diego State Surf 'N Slam Tournament. Auburn will open against Valparaiso and will face either San Diego State or Wake Forest in the consolation/championship round.

### Florida Gators

Florida showed little signs of rust following a nine-day break from competition to focus on final exams, as the Gators defeated Southern U., 62-35, in the first round of the Gator Holiday Classic on Sunday. The win placed UF in the championship game of the event against High Point held on Monday evening in the team's last game before the Christmas break. After a few days off, UF then returns to the court and plays host to Ohio U. on Dec. 28 and Jacksonville on Dec. 30. Sunday's game was the Gators first at home since Dec. 1. Florida has advanced to the championship game of its home holiday tournament all 19 years of its existence, capturing the title 15 times. Sophomore Azania Stewart is averaging 17.5 points in UF's last two home games. Sophomore guard Jordan Jones has hit at least one 3-pointer in every game this year, while senior guard Susan Yenser has now hit a 3-pointer in eight consecutive games. The Gators are averaging 7.9 three-

pointers per game this year.

### Georgia Lady Bulldogs

Georgia returned to action following a 12-day break during Final Exams and defeated No. 19/17 Virginia, 69-53, on Sunday. The win improved the Lady Bulldogs to 10-0 on the year, the seventh time in Andy Landers' 31 seasons in Athens that UGA has started the season with a double-digit win streak. The Georgia record for best start was a 14-0 opening during the 1998-99 campaign. Jasmine James posted team-high tallies of 17 points, 10 rebounds and three steals to lead the Lady Bulldogs over Virginia. James posted her first career double-double. Angel Robinson also notched a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds. Two Lady Bulldogs posted double-doubles in the same game for the first time since a loss at Detroit last season. Porsha Phillips scored 14 points, including 10 in the first 4:31 of the second half as Georgia expanded its lead to 24 points. The Lady Bulldogs conclude their pre-holiday slate by hosting Detroit on Tuesday night. Georgia owns a 2-1 edge in its all-time series with the Titans but dropped a 70-66 decision last season. Among UGA's career leaders, Ashley Houts enters the UDM game nine points from No. 20, one steal from No. 6 and seven free throw attempts from No. 9.

### Kentucky Wildcats

Kentucky improved to a school-record 10-0 start with a resounding 101-67 win over intrastate rival Louisville on Sunday. It was the Cats' only game of the week due to final exams. The attendance of 7,323 was a season high and the eighth highest for a women's basketball game in Memorial Coliseum. The Cats forced Louisville into a school-record 38 turnovers and UK charted a season-high 21 steals in the game. It marked the most steals since recording a program-best 28 vs. West Virginia in 1993. The Cats also hit a school-record 36 free throws on 52 attempts. Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by junior forward Victoria Dunlap's game-high 27 points. She also added a team-high nine rebounds and a career-best eight steals and career-high tying four blocks. Junior point guard Amber Smith netted a career-high 19 points and dished out a game-high five assists while freshman guard A'dia Mathies and junior Carly Morrow added 15 and 12 points, respectively. All 10 players that saw action scored at least two points. UK returns to action Tuesday, Dec. 22 vs. UT-Martin in Memorial before a short break for the holidays.

### LSU Lady Tigers

No. 18 Nebraska jumped out to an early 21-6 lead and then put together 12-2 run early in the second half to deal the fifth-ranked LSU Lady Tigers their first loss of the season by a score of 77-63 in front of 7,717 fans at the Devaney Center on Sunday afternoon.

LSU (9-1) saw its nine-game winning streak come to an end after beginning the season with its best start since 2005. The Lady Tigers and Huskers were one of 12 unbeaten teams entering play on Sunday. LSU returns home via commercial flight on Monday before taking on Southeastern Louisiana at 7 p.m. CST Tuesday in the Maravich Center. The contest will be the final non-conference home game for the Lady Tigers and the last overall home game until Pack the PMAC 14 on

### Ole Miss Rebels

The Ole Miss women's basketball team posted a 2-1 record during the week and improved to 8-4 overall heading into the Christmas break. The Rebels opened the week with a heart-breaking 64-58 loss at No. 17 Texas Wednesday night. Ole Miss led by seven points with just under eight minutes remaining, but the Longhorns closed the game on a 22-9 run to claim the victory. Shantell Black led the Rebels with 15 points and three assists, while Bianca Thomas added 13. Katorra Lewis finished with 11 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Ole Miss rebounded in thrilling fashion in the following to earn a 73-72 come-from-behind win over Memphis Friday night. Trailing by two points, Elizabeth Robertson hit the game-winning three-pointer with 2.3 seconds left on the clock to lift the Rebels to victory. It was her one and only three-pointer of the night and she had missed her previous six three-point attempts. Kayla Melson scored a career-high 17 points for Ole Miss to surpass her previous career-high of 16 she posted last week against Ohio State. Thomas finished with 13 points, while Black added 11 points and nine assists. Memphis native LaKendra Phillips chipped in with 11 points and tied her career-high with eight rebounds. Nikki Byrd finished with 10 points and seven rebounds and was the fifth Rebel in double figures. In the final game of the week, the Rebels scored 100 points for the first time since 2006 and seven Ole Miss players reached double figures en route to a 101-46 win over Winston-Salem State. Melson finished with 12 points and dished out six of Ole Miss' 31 assists to help tie for the third-most assists in a game in school history. Sophomore guard LaTosha Laws poured in a career-high 10 points and a career-high five rebounds, and freshman Courtney Marbra scored a career-high seven points, pulled down a career-high six rebounds and dished out a career-high four assists. The Rebels shot 65.5 percent in the first half on 21-of-32 shooting and limited the Lady Rams to just six field goals and held a 64-20 lead at halftime. The 64 points tied the second-highest scoring output for a half in school history, falling just five points shy of setting a new school record. Ole Miss returns to action Dec. 29 when the Rebels host Centenary at 4:30 p.m. from Tad Smith Coliseum in the final game before conference play.

### Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs

The Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs went 2-1 this past week with victories over Samford and Mississippi Valley State before dropping a game at #12 Xavier on Sunday. The Lady Bulldogs (8-4). Against Samford and MVSU in the midweek, State outscored the two opponents 168-94. Against the Bulldogs of SU, Alexis Rack led the MSU scoring attack, scoring 15 points. MSU came up just shy of the school single game fg percentage record shooting 63.3 percent for the game. State would follow against the Delta Devilletes, shooting over 50 percent to dominate MVSU 88-53 to move to 7-0 at home on the year. Against Xavier in Cincinnati, State would be doomed by turnovers, giving it away a season-high 25 times. In the 81-60 defeat, State would shoot just 32.1 percent. Mary Kathryn Govero would be the leading scorer for MSU, scoring 15. With 13 points, Rack completed her 26th consecutive double-digit scoring game. State will be off for 10

days and won't see action until Dec. 30 when they host Alcorn State.

### South Carolina Gamecocks

South Carolina closed out its three-game stretch against ACC teams with a 10-point win over Wake Forest at home and an eight-point loss to No. 9/10 North Carolina in Myrtle Beach. The Gamecocks have out-rebounded their last five opponents, including the Tar Heels (40-38) who had been beating their opponents on the boards by an average of 9.9 rebounds per outing. La'Keisha Sutton was the top scorer for the first time this season with 18 points against Wake Forest. Kelsey Bone and Valerie Nainima netted 27 and 26 points, respectively, against North Carolina as the Gamecocks shot a season-high 50.7 percent from the field, including 55.6 percent in the second half. The duo narrowly missed turning in the season's second double double-double as Bone pulled down 10 rebounds and Nainima handed out nine assists.

### Tennessee Lady Volunteers

Following the reporting of grades for the 2009 Fall semester two more Lady Vols added the Vol Scholar patch to their uniform. Rookies Taber Spani recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA and Faith Dupree pulled all As and a B to earn a patch. With their addition, eight Lady Vols are proudly displaying VOLScholar patches on their jerseys this coming semester – Briana Bass, Angie Bjorklund, Kelley Cain, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Sydney Smallbone. The VOLScholar program is an initiative of UT's Thornton Athletics Student Life Center which is a comprehensive academic and citizenship-building program that has gained enthusiastic support from UT's men's and women's athletic teams. Student-athletes earn the right to wear the VOLScholar patch on their uniform by achieving a 3.0 grade-point average during the previous fall and/or spring semester. In response to an inordinate amount of phone calls, mail and texts from Tennessee fans, the Lady Vols names are back on their jerseys. Coach Pat Summitt dropped the names from the back of the jerseys prior to the start of the 2004-05 season. Before the Lady Vols played Louisville the other night, Summitt announced to the crowd that she had an early Christmas present for them – names on jerseys – the crowd erupted into cheers when the team came out to show their new duds. Until the loss to Stanford on Dec. 19, Tennessee's 9-0 start to begin the 2009-10 campaign tied for the ninth best start in Lady Vol program history. All-time, there have been 15 perfect starts to a season (of at least 7 wins).

### Vanderbilt Commodores

With the win over Tennessee State, Vanderbilt moves to 10-1 on the season. Against Tennessee State, Vanderbilt's Merideth Marsh led all scorers with 24 points, two shy of her career-high. Jessica Mooney and Hannah Tuomi followed each with 15 points. It was Mooney's season-high. By allowing only 47 points to TSU Sunday, Vanderbilt has now kept an opponent under 50 points three times this season. The Commodores held St. Joseph's to 46 points and Wright State to 46. Vanderbilt is off until Dec. 28 when they host East Tennessee State at 7 pm CT.

## SEC Notes

**Leader In Women's Basketball**

The Southeastern Conference stands firmly as the nation's premier intercollegiate women's basketball conference. The league leads the nation with **EIGHT** national championships, **TEN** runner-up finishes, **34** Final Four appearances and **94** first-team All-America honors.

**SEC Begins 28th Season Of Conference Play**

This will be the 28th season of conference play for the SEC. Women's basketball first came under the auspices of the SEC in the 1982-83 season. Games played between SEC teams before that time are not counted in the all-time SEC standings, since there was no uniform number of conference games played prior to that time.

**Around The SEC**

- Four SEC teams were ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN preseason polls. Tennessee was ranked eighth by the Associated Press and ninth in the coaches poll. LSU was ranked ninth in AP and 17th in coaches, while Vanderbilt was ranked 20th in the coaches and 22nd in AP. Georgia was ranked 21st in the Associated Press poll. Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Mississippi State and South Carolina each received votes in the polls.

- Three SEC players earned preseason honors from various publications and outlets. LSU's Allison Hightower (Sporting News - First Team, ESPN.com - Second Team, Lindy's - Third Team); Georgia's Ashley Houts (Lindy's - Third Team); and Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen (Sporting News - Third Team) were all honored.

- Three SEC players have been named preseason candidates for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award. Included on the list of Top 30 are: Angie Bjorklund (Tennessee), Allison Hightower (LSU), Ashley Houts (Georgia).

- Three SEC players have been named to the Naismith Trophy watch list. Included on the list are Allison Hightower (LSU), Ashley Houts (Georgia) and Shekinna Stricklen (Tennessee).

- Two SEC players headline the list of preseason candidates for the 2009-10 Wade Trophy. Included in the list are Allison Hightower (LSU) and Ashley Houts (Georgia).

- LSU's Allison Hightower, Georgia's Ashley Houts, Vanderbilt's Jessica Mooney and Ole Miss' Bianca Thomas have been named candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

- Five of the top 10 scorers from last season return to the SEC. Ole Miss' Bianca Thomas ranked fourth last year with an average of 15.8 ppg. Allison Hightower, LSU (5th - 14.9 ppg); Alexis Rack, Mississippi State (6th - 14.9 ppg); Shekinna Stricklen, Tennessee (9th - 13.3 ppg); and Victoria Dunlap, Kentucky (10th - 12.8 ppg) round out the top 10.

- The top two rebounders from last season return. Georgia's Angel Robinson who averaged 9.3 rpg and Kentucky's Victoria Dunlap who averaged 9.1 rpg return to the hardwood for the SEC.

- With Kayla Melson's triple-double to start the season. There are two active SEC players that hold the honor. Melson (Ole Miss) had 11 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists against Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 13, 2009. She joined Arkansas' C'eira Ricketts who had 14 points, 13 rebounds and 12 assists against Auburn on January 18, 2009. Overall there have been 21 triple-doubles in the SEC.
