Team Notes

Alabama Crimson Tide

The Alabama women's basketball team moved to 5-4 on the season with a 72-67 loss at Alabama State last Friday followed by a 61-56 win against Northwestern State on Sunday. In Friday's contest in Montgomery, the Crimson Tide shot better than 42 percent from the field but could not overcome the Hornet's 48 trips to the free-throw line. Junior Tierney Jenkins led the game in scoring with 20 points and added 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Behind Jenkins was junior LaToya King with 14. King also handed out a game-best six assists and grabbed two steals. Alabama returned to Coleman Coliseum on Sunday for just its third home game of the season where senior Dedrea Magee scored a season-high 19 points to lead the Tide past the Lady Demons. A late 13-2 run in the second half helped Alabama pull away from Northwestern State to remain undefeated at home. Jenkins narrowly missed a double-double with eight points and nine rebounds in the contest. In addition, junior Alyson Butler added nine points off the bench on 4-of-5 shooting. The Tide has a one-week hiatus from competition before it hits the road again for a pair of games in the Sunshine State. Alabama takes on UCF on Monday, Dec. 14 at 6:00 p.m. (CST) followed by a 5:00 p.m. (CST) tilt on Wednesday, Dec. 16 at Florida A&M.

Arkansas Razorbacks

The Razorbacks (5-2) return to Bud Walton Arena for a final game before finals hosting Coppin State Tuesday at 7 p.m. The Razorbacks continue practice during final exams and return to the hardwood Dec. 17 at Northwestern. It is the first of four away games before the holiday. Arkansas is at Northwestern and continues on to the Dual in the Desert Dec. 19-21, opening with DePaul in the first round. Arkansas suffered a disappointing loss at No. 18 Oklahoma Saturday. The Razorbacks were up by as many as 16 before OU turned up their offense for the comeback. Arkansas pushed the game to overtime but fell, 87-76. Senior Charity Ford transitioned from a bench player last year (the SEC's Sixth Player of the Year) to a starter this year and leads the team in scoring. The Texas native leads Arkansas with 12.9 points-per-game this year, well above her 7.3 average of last season. Freshman Sarah Watkins continues to play well in her first season as a Razorback. Watkins has had five games in double figures with a season/career-best 20 against Alcorn State. She was just two shy of that with 18 at No. 18 Oklahoma last week.

Auburn Tigers

Auburn (6-3) went 2-0 last week with a road win at defending MEAC champion North Carolina A&T (76-63) and a home win over George Washington (62-43). Senior KeKe Carrier led the Tigers on the week, averaging 22.5 points and 9.0 rebounds per game. She also tallied her second double-double of the season against North Carolina A&T, setting a new career high with 28 points while tying her career high with 13 rebounds. Against North Carolina A&T, Auburn shot 52.6 percent from the field as Carrier led a pack of four Tigers that finished in double digits. Alli Smalley and freshman Nicolle Thomas scored 11 points each while freshman Blanche Alverson came off the bench for 10 points. Against GW, Auburn limited the Colonials to four field goals in the first half, taking a 31-14 lead into the locker room. The Tigers were able to hold off a 13-0 GW run in the second half to re-build their lead and take the 62-43 win. Smalley led

Auburn with 19 points, followed by Carrier with 17 and Alverson with 14 off the bench. Sophomore Parrisha Simmons pulled down a career high 12 rebounds in the game. Auburn will take a 10-day break for final exams and will return to action at 6 p.m., Dec. 15 at home against defending Big South champion Liberty.

Florida Gators

The Gators have two more road games this week, playing at Rutgers on Monday in the Women's Jimmy V Classic, and at Old Dominion on Friday. The games conclude a stretch that has featured four of the last five away from Gainesville. The Gators have used five different starting lineups in the team's first seven games, while five different players have been the team's top scorer in those seven contests. Steffi Sorensen has been the only Gator who has started every game this season. Jordan Jones has scored in double-figures in five of UF's seven outings. Sharielle Smith recently played in her 100th career game, topping the 700-point plateau in that same game. Entering this week's pair of games, Florida is averaging 8.3 three-pointers per contest, having connected on 58 thru seven games. The Gators will take several days off for final exams following Friday's battle at Old Dominion.

Georgia Lady Bulldogs

The Lady Bulldogs' 71-42 victory over UAB was their largest victory margin of the season. Porsha Phillips' came within a rebound of a double-double in the first half alone against the Blazers and eventually finished with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Georgia improved to 29-3 all-time against Georgia Tech – including a 12-0 mark in Athens – with its 56-50 victory on Sunday. Phillips again led the Lady Bulldogs with 14 points, while Meredith Mitchell equaled her career high with eight rebounds. Georgia won despite playing the final 9:30 without Ashley Houts after she fouled out. The Lady Bulldogs also shot just 38.2 percent from the free throw line, connecting on 13-of-34 attempts. That was Georgia's worst effort at the stripe percentage wise since Feb. 14, 1999. Angel Robinson became the Lady Bulldogs' 31st career 1,000-point scorer during the win over the Yellow Jackets. Georgia hosts Tennessee State on Tuesday night before a 12-day break for Final Exams on the UGA campus. The Lady Bulldogs are 3-0 all-time against Tennessee State, including a 2-0 mark in Athens. Georgia has not played the Lady Tigers since Jan. 18, 1989, a 102-32 victory.

Kentucky Wildcats

Kentucky remains undefeated at 8-0 after wins over Miami (Ohio) and Cincinnati last week. The 8-0 start equals the 2005-06 squad for the second-best start in school history. UK defeated Miami 107-53, the largest margin of victory since 2005. It marked the most points scored by the Cats in a regulation game since 2000 and it was the first 100-point game in the Matthew Mitchell era. The Wildcats, who have won 14 of their 15 games vs. non-conference opponents, now look to tie the best start in school history at 9-0 set in 1980-81. The first opportunity will be Sunday, Dec. 13 vs. Florida A&M. UK faces the Rattlers in the first of three consecutive home games. Junior forward Victoria Dunlap has continued to dominate on both ends of the floor as she averaged 15.5 points, 11.5 rebounds, 4.5 steals and 3.5 blocks in two games last week. The junior currently ranks No. 5 on UK's career double-doubles list and No. 6 on the all-time blocks list. She has totaled

799 career points in just 73 career games.

LSU Lady Tigers

The seventh-ranked LSU women's basketball team held off a last-second shot attempt from Louisiana Tech to remain unbeaten by a score of 77-74 in the Lady Tigers' only game last week. LSU is in the midst of academic finals and only had one game on the schedule. Preseason All-American guard Allison Hightower poured in a career-high 32 points, including 25 in the first half. LSU is 6-0 for the first time since winning the first 14 games of the 2005-06 season. The Lady Tigers also defeated a Louisiana opponent for the 31st straight time. LSU has not lost to an in-state opponent since 1999. Hightower eclipsed her previous career high of 26 points in last year's NCAA Tournament first round win over Green Bay. Hightower's 32 points were the most by an LSU player since Seimone Augustus dropped 35 points at Florida on Feb. 16, 2006. Her 25 points in the first half were the most by an LSU player in a half since Elaine Powell had 27 points in a half at SMU on Jan. 10, 1996. Hightower leads LSU with 18.0 points per contest. Sophomore forward LaSondra Barrett averages 11.5 points and sophomore forward Taylor Turnbow is tops on the team in rebounds with 6.3 per game. LSU takes on New Orleans on Sunday at 2 p.m. in the Maravich Center.

Ole Miss Rebels

The Ole Miss women's basketball team posted a 1-1 record during the week and now own a 6-2 overall record after winning 70-51 at UALR Wednesday night and falling at Old Dominion 75-66 Sunday afternoon. The Rebels won their third road game of the season Wednesday as All-SEC guard Bianca Thomas became the 23rd player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points. She finished with a game-high 29 points against the Trojans and tied the school record with seven three-pointers in a single game. It was actually the second time in her career she had accomplished the feat, duplicating the performance last season at Mississippi State. Kayla Melson returned to the Ole Miss lineup after missing a pair of games and finished with 14 points, a game-high nine rebounds and five assists. On Sunday at Old Dominion, Thomas finished with a game-high 25 points and hit five three-pointers to lead the Rebels. Shantell Black finished with 17 points and four assists and Melson added 12 points and a game-high seven assists. Senior post Katorra Lewis grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds. Ole Miss returns to action Sunday at 1 p.m. when the Rebels welcome third-ranked Ohio State to Tad Smith Coliseum.

Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs

In its only game this past week, the Mississippi State women's basketball team moved past Southern Mississippi 85-52 to improve to 5-3 on the season. Against the Lady Eagles, State put four players in double figures led by Alexis Racks' 21 points as she completed her 22nd-straight double-digit performance. Rack also added nine assists and only two turnovers. Rack currently ranks second in the SEC in scoring, averaging 19.1 points a game. Mary Kathryn Govero had a career-high 21 points, going 9-12 from the field, including three, 3-pointers. Armelie Lumanu had 16 points while Tysheka Grimes added 12. As a team, State shot 53.3 percent from the field while limiting USM to 38.5 percent shooting. Through eight games, the Lady Bulldogs are averaging a +20.8 scoring mar-

gin, shooting 40.7 percent and limiting opponents to 36.0 percent shooting. The Lady Bulldogs return to action, Saturday, Dec. 12 when they travel to Ruston, La. to take on Louisiana Tech. That game is scheduled to tip at 7 p.m. State then returns home for two games, playing Samford on Dec. 14 before hosting Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 16.

South Carolina Gamecocks

South Carolina battled past High Point 70-52 on Wednesday leading into an 11-day break for exams. The Gamecocks got a career-high seven steals and 14 points from junior point guard Samone Kennedy to hold off a tough Panther squad. Looking ahead, South Carolina will run a gauntlet of three ACC teams before heading home for the Christmas holiday. The Gamecocks host NC State on Jan. 13 and Wake Forest on Jan. 17 before a neutral-site battle against North Carolina on Jan. 20 in Myrtle Beach.

Tennessee Lady Volunteers

Lady Vol junior Angie Bjorklund is now just 235 points away from 1,000 career points. She scored 318 as a rookie and 344 as a sophomore. This season, she has 103 to date for a career total of 765. She will become the 34th all-time player to reach the 1,000 point club. Lady Vol assistant basketball coach Daedra Charles-Furlow announced on Dec. 1 that she is dealing with medical issues. Tennessee junior sharpshooter Angie Bjorklund has climbed into sole possession of fourth place on the Tennessee three-point career charts. She has 153 made treys for her career moving her ahead of Shannon Bobbitt (2006-08). Ahead of Bjorklund are Brittany Jackson in third with 161...Kara Lawson in second with 256 and Shanna Zolman is leading the pack with 266. Finals exams for Fall semester continue this week on "The Hill." Tennessee will be off for finals until a trip to Madison Square Garden in New York City to face Rutgers in the Maggie Dixon Classic, Dec. 13 at 3:30 pm (ESPNU).

Vanderbilt Commodores

Vanderbilt (8-1) rebounded from its first loss of the season to defeat its biggest non-conference rival, Western Kentucky, 79-73 in overtime. The Commodores and Lady Toppers have faced off 31 times, with VU holding a 19-12 advantage. The 31 meetings are more games than Vanderbilt has played against Southeastern Conference rival South Carolina. Senior Merideth Marsh, the SEC Player of the Week, and junior Jence Rhoads led the Commodores with scoring with 17 apiece. The duo combined to score 11 of Vanderbilt's 17 points in the five-minute overtime after the Commodores had produced only 24 points in the entire second half. Five Commodores scored in double figures, including junior Hannah Tuomi, senior Jessica Mooney and freshman Tiffany Clarke. The Commodores will travel this week to Quinnipiac (Hamden, Conn.) for a Thursday night matchup with the Bobcats. Vanderbilt will then take a 10-day break during final exams. The Commodores have played six games in the past 13 days, and will play only two games over the next 20 days due to the holiday break.

SEC Notes

Leader In Women's Basketball

The Southeastern Conference stands firmly as the nation's premier intercollegiate women's basketball conference. The league leads the nation with **EIGHT** national championships, **TEN** runner-up finishes, **34** Final Four appearances and **94** first-team All-America honors.

SEC Begins 28th Season Of Conference Play

This will be the 28th season of conference play for the SEC. Women's basketball first came under the auspices of the SEC in the 1982-83 season. Games played between SEC teams before that time are not counted in the all-time SEC standings, since there was no uniform number of conference games played prior to that time.

Around The SEC

- Four SEC teams were ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN preseason polls. Tennessee was ranked eighth by the Associated Press and ninth in the coaches poll. LSU was ranked ninth in AP and 17th in coaches, while Vanderbilt was ranked 20th in the coaches and 22nd in AP. Georgia was ranked 21st in the Associated Press poll. Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Mississippi State and South Carolina each received votes in the polls.

- Three SEC players earned preseason honors from various publications and outlets. LSU's Allison Hightower (Sporting News - First Team, ESPN.com - Second Team, Lindy's - Third Team); Georgia's Ashley Houts (Lindy's - Third Team); and Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen (Sporting News - Third Team) were all honored.

- Three SEC players have been named preseason candidates for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award. Included on the list of Top 30 are: Angie Bjorklund (Tennessee), Allison Hightower (LSU), Ashley Houts (Georgia).

- Three SEC players have been named to the Naismith Trophy watch list. Included on the list are Allison Hightower (LSU), Ashley Houts (Georgia) and Shekinna Stricklen (Tennessee).

- Two SEC players headline the list of preseason candidates for the 2009-10 Wade Trophy. Included in the list are Allison Hightower (LSU) and Ashley Houts (Georgia).

- LSU's Allison Hightower, Georgia's Ashley Houts, Vanderbilt's Jessica Mooney and Ole Miss' Bianca Thomas have been named candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

- Five of the top 10 scorers from last season return to the SEC. Ole Miss' Bianca Thomas ranked fourth last year with an average of 15.8 ppg. Allison Hightower, LSU (5th - 14.9 ppg); Alexis Rack, Mississippi State (6th - 14.9 ppg); Shekinna Stricklen, Tennessee (9th - 13.3 ppg); and Victoria Dunlap, Kentucky (10th - 12.8 ppg) round out the top 10.

- The top two rebounders from last season return. Georgia's Angel Robinson who averaged 9.3 rpg and Kentucky's Victoria Dunlap who averaged 9.1 rpg return to the hardwood for the SEC.

- With Kayla Melson's triple-double to start the season. There are two active SEC players that hold the honor. Melson (Ole Miss) had 11 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists against Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 13, 2009. She joined Arkansas' C'eira Ricketts who had 14 points, 13 rebounds and 12 assists against Auburn on January 18, 2009. Overall there have been 21 triple-doubles in the SEC.
